Feeding sweets causing skin disease in monkeys at Jaipur’s Galtaji temple: Experts

JAIPUR, JULY 12: Feeding monkeys with sweets as part of religious practices is leading to the spread of a serious skin disease among them at the Galtaji temple here, experts have warned.A large number of monkeys in and around the popular pilgrimage site are suffering from hyperkeratosis, a skin condition marked by symptoms such as hair loss, cracked skin, bleeding wounds and difficulty in movement, they said.

Locals said the condition has spread rapidly among monkeys in the area, with several primates unable to walk, jump or climb trees due to worsening health conditions. Also known as the ‘monkey temple’, the GaltajiMandir in Jaipur is an 18th-century pilgrimage site built from pink sandstone, which is famous for its natural freshwater springs and large population of macaques and langurs. Senior wildlife veterinarian Ashok Tanwar said that monkeys on the temple premises are suffering from a condition called hyperkeratosis, primarily caused due to the changes in their diet due to human feeding habits.

“Red-faced monkeys are affected by hyperkeratosis, which creates a condition similar to severe skin dryness seen in humans,” Tanwar told PTI. The disease is spreading due to excessive feeding of sweets, with most cases seen among monkeys living around the temple, he said.“Due to changes in diet, the skin becomes dry and cracks because of a lack of moisture,” Tanwar said. Terming the condition treatable, he said, “Since 2020, many such monkeys have been treated successfully.”

“People feed monkeys chana, makhana and laddoos. Regular consumption of such food

leads to allergies and skin problems. If monkeys are allowed their natural diet and live in their natural environment, they can recover in most cases,” Tanwar said. While wildlife experts say that the natural diet of monkeys includes roots, fruits, vegetables and leaves, religious sentiments often lead people to offer them sweets and processed food, causing long-term health damage. Forest officials said the disease has spread among monkeys in the Galta area for which awareness measures are being taken.

Regional Forest Officer Jitendra Singh Shekhawat said, “We regularly conduct awareness campaigns to tell people not to feed sweets, makhana or processed food to monkeys and langurs. They should be left on their natural diet.” Warning boards have been installed in and around the Galtaji temple, urging visitors not to feed monkeys, Shekhawat said. According to forest officials, while capturing monkeys for treatment is challenging due to their agility, teams from the municipal corporation have been roped in to assist in catching the infected animals and shifting them to the Jaipur zoo for treatment. Wildlife enthusiast RohitGangwal said many devotees unknowingly harm the animals.

“People feed monkeys laddoos, biscuits and even ice-cream, which they cannot digest due to their excessive sugar content. The disease spreads from one monkey to another,” Gangwal said. He warned that the monkey population could decline significantly if such practices continue.The experts cautioned that unless public behaviour changes and monkeys are allowed access to their natural diet, the disease could spread further and pose a serious threat to their survival.

Kerala Devaswom minister flags court's 'excessive intervention' in temple affairs

THRISSUR (KERALA), JULY 12: Kerala Devaswom Minister K Muralaheedharan on Sunday criticised what he termed as “excessive intervention” by the Kerala High Court in temple affairs, alleging that the court was deciding even which flowers should be used at the hill shrine of Sabarimala. While speaking at a function here, Muralaheedharan said there was a need to examine whether such extensive judicial intervention in the affairs of temples was warranted.

“Everything is being decided by the court. At Sabarimala, neither devotees nor the government have any role. The High Court even decides which flowers should be used and how the queue should be there,” he said. The minister said he had already raised the issue in the Assembly, where he could speak freely without the fear of inviting contempt of court proceedings. “When we speak outside, questions of contempt arise. It is time to think about whether there should be such excessive intervention in temple affairs,” he added.

More than 31,000 police, drones to guard RathYatra in Ahmedabad

AHMEDABAD, JULY 12: Gujarat Chief Minister Bhupendra Patel reviewed security and civic preparedness for the 149th Jagannath Rath Yatra, which will see the deployment of more than 31,000 police personnel and 65 drones in the city on July 16.

Chairing a high-level review meeting in Gandhinagar on Saturday, Patel directed officials to ensure the safe passage of over 230 processions statewide. The annual RathYatra—one of Gujarat’s largest religious events—is

set to pass through several communally sensitive localities in the city, including Jamalpur, Kalupur, Shahpur, and Dariyapur. Patel instructed the police department to ensure that all RathYatras, including six small ones in Ahmedabad, are conducted in a secure environment and that devotees participate without any untoward incidents, an official release stated. He also directed the Ahmedabad Municipal Corporation (AMC) to ensure that people do not gather on or near dilapidated buildings and structures along the route to watch the procession.

Drive in Indore to plant 21 lakh saplings, install 51,000 rainwater harvesting units

INDORE, JULY 12: Madhya Pradesh Chief Minister Mohan Yadav launched a campaign in Indore on Sunday to plant 21 lakh saplings and install 51,000 rainwater harvesting units during the monsoon as part of efforts to tackle climate change and water scarcity.

Addressing a gathering at the function here, Yadav said Prime Minister Narendra Modi’s ‘Ek Ped Maa Ke Naam’ campaign has evolved into a mass movement across the country. Climate change

posed growing challenges and discussions were underway on the possible impact of El Nino on this year’s monsoon, he noted.

“Plantation is the most effective way to address these challenges. There is no better means than trees to maintain ecological balance,” the chief minister said. Yadav said nearly 2.75 lakh water conservation works valued at around Rs 10,000 crore have been undertaken this year under the state government’s ‘Jal Ganga Samvardhan Abhiyan’. State Urban Development and Housing Minister

Kailash Vijayvargiya, who is spearheading the plantation drive in Indore, said locations had already been identified for planting 22.5 lakh saplings in the city during the current monsoon against the target of 21 lakh plantations.

The campaign also marked the launch of a drive to install 51,000 rainwater harvesting units across the city. Vijayvargiya said Indore faced a severe water crisis this summer as nearly 80 per cent of its borewells had dried up.

“If we harvest

rainwater, next summer will be much better for us,” he said.

Indore, the country’s cleanest city with a population of over 35 lakh, depends largely on the Narmada river for its drinking water needs. Water is pumped from Jalud in neighbouring Khargone district through an about 80-km pipeline and supplied to households on alternate days.

During the function, Yadav also felicitated Border Security Force (BSF) constables Ravi Chauhan and Ramendra Singh and announced a

reward of Rs 2 lakh each from the state government. The two personnel had displayed exemplary courage despite suffering serious injuries in an improvised explosive device (IED) blast during an anti-Naxal operation in Chhattisgarh last year, according to officials.

State BJP president Hemant Khandelwal and Panchayat and Rural Development Minister Prahlad Singh Patel were also present at the event

Will immortalise legendary playback singer Janaki's legacy: CM Shivakumar

BENGALURU, JULY 12: Karnataka Chief Minister D K Shivakumar on Sunday said that the government would accord full state honours to legendary playback singer S Janaki and would explore ways to immortalise her legacy, describing the late singer as one of India's greatest musical icons. Janaki died at a private hospital in Mysuru on Saturday due to age-related ailments. She was 88.

According to family sources, she developed breathing difficulties on Friday night and was admitted to the hospital, where she passed away. Her funeral will take place later in the day. Speaking to reporters in Bengaluru, Shivakumar said the government had made arrangements for the public to pay their last respects to Janaki in Mysuru before her funeral with full state honours. He also said he would hold discussions with members of the film industry on measures to preserve her legacy.

"One of India's most iconic personalities, the legendary playback singer who came to be known as

the 'Gana Kogile' (Nightingale of Song), Janaki, is no longer with us. She served our film industry in all languages for nearly 50 years," Shivakumar said. The chief minister said he had spoken to Janaki's family on Saturday and had offered to facilitate the transportation of her mortal remains to Chennai or Hyderabad if the family wished.

"I asked her family, if you wanted to take her to Chennai, I will make arrangements. If you want to take her to Hyderabad, I will have her airlifted there. But they said no. Our grandmother's final wish was to remain in Mysuru. That is why they brought her here," he said. Shivakumar said the government had arranged for members of the public to pay their last respects in Mysuru until Sunday afternoon. He said he had directed Minister Yathindra Siddaramaiah to cancel his scheduled programme and represent the state government at the funeral. Paying tribute to Janaki's contribution to Indian music, Shivakumar noted that she had received four National Film Awards, 33 state awards and the
